Collaboration is the act of working together to accomplish a common goal. Effective collaboration involves the following:

- Mutual respect
- Communication
- Built trust
- Investment
- Shared responsibility

- It's not about the system or process
- It benefits everyone on the team
- It increases productivity in the long term
- It eliminates the "battle"
- It models communication and self-advocacy skills for the student
