

# **Previous Training**




Figure 4 Graph showing survey results which indicate that participants are evenly divided between those who have had previous training and not.

# Do you think your student's IEP incorporates an Active Learning approach?




Figure 5 Graph of survey results for the question "Do you think your student's IEP incorporates an Active Learning approach? Yes = 22%, No =22%, Sort of = 25%, 28% = I don't work directly with students.




Figure 9 Screenshot of the "Subscribe ot our mailing list" form on the website along side a picture of an Active Learning Wall with an announcement of the Active Learning Space eNewsletter.
