
# From the Front Lines: Deaf/Hard of Hearing Early Interventionists Supporting Families

## Facts:

- NMSD EIDS saw a marked improvement in developmental gains once Deaf professionals began to see families
- Skill development is enhanced by working with Deaf specialists by "teaching" (modeling, mentoring, introducing, exposing) and use of strategies. - Several studies have shown that the most accessible pathway for full access to linguistic information for many Deaf children is through vision. 
